A subordinate clause will begin with a <u>subordinate conjunction</u> and will contain both a <u>subject</u> and a <u>verb</u>. This combination of words will *not* form a <u>complete sentence</u>. It will instead make a reader want additional information to finish the thought.

**Remember:** A subordinate clause cannot stand alone as a sentence because it does not provide a complete thought. The reader is left wondering, "So what happened?"
