It is important that your child reads every night- even if just for 10 minutes. Reading independently is important, however, you can also help your child to develop their comprehension skills by hearing them read and asking effective auestions.

After your child has read a few pages to you, use these question starters to ask them questions about the text.

This will help your child develop a range of reading skills, which will prepare them for testing in school, as well helping them become effective and confident readers.
