## Your child's progress and attainment

A big thank you to all the families who have supported children's learning during lockdown this term. We really appreciate your dedication to your child's education.

Pupils have returned after lockdown very well and nearly all have had excellent learning attitudes over the last 4 weeks!

If your child is in year 1 to 6, you have been sent details of current attainment and progress in reading and maths. All children will discuss their learning with teachers at a one to one conference early next term.

The data identifies where their strengths and weaknesses lie in reading and maths. In school, we use this information next term and plan carefully to meet their individual needs. We want every child in school to be the best they can be and ready for the next academic year!

Currently, whole school targets include:

- ✓ Improving fine motor skills and handwriting
- ✓ Making sure all children are enabled to meet their end of year targets in reading, writing and mathematics following the impact of school closures
- Improving physical fitness and mental wellbeing post lockdown (sports clubs are starting after the holidays including extra lunchtime activities!)

## Update on bags

#### COVID

Children must not attend school if they or anyone in their house has COVID 19 symptoms or has tested positive in last 7 days.

- New continuous cough
- High temperature (37.8+)
- Loss of or change in normal sense of taste or smell

What will happen if families report absence due to any of above symptoms:

- 1. The child must isolate for 10 days
- 2. The family must isolate for 10 days
- 3. The symptomatic person(s) should get tested via <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/or by phoning 119">https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/or by phoning 119</a>.

The school is working very closely with Public Health England and <u>all</u> reports of above symptoms are followed up.

For this reason, absence must be reported correctly and honestly.

If anyone displays symptoms in school, they are isolated and sent home.

At West Park, we continue to fund an additional cleaner during the school day out of school budget. This ensures all key parts of school, surfaces and toilets are hygienic. Please follow guidelines to help us keep all the community safe.

#### How can you help further?

Families can now obtain lateral flow testing kits for use at home, to test adults who have children in schools. Testing people without symptoms is crucial in reducing spread as it means that the chain of transmission can be broken.
