## Pupil Premium Strategy at West Park Primary School 2019/20

The school has been allocated an estimated £179,520 pupil premium funding for this period. This is £1,320 allocated per pupil who has been entitled to free school meals at any time during the last 6 years—based on estimate of 136 pupils. Additional funding is also received for EY Pupil Premium (£1,813) and £10,298 government grant for specific pupils. The purpose of the funding is to close the attainment gap between disadvantaged pupils and all other pupils primarily through quality first teaching and then a tiered approach through targeted support and wider strategies linked to non-academic barriers. This is based on a range of research e.g. Sutton Trust, John Hattie effect sizes, EEF and other wider reading.
