This term year 5 will be studying a range of topics.



still life, and looking at the work of William Morris.


Science—May the force be with you as science is out of this world...Can you guess what our topics could be?



Maths and English

Maths—place value, including decimal numbers; reasoning and problem solving; addition and subtraction; multiplication and division; negative numbers; properties of shape and coordinates. Y5 children are expected to have rapid recall of 12 x 12 multiplication and division facts.

English—visual literacy, using clips from *Oliver Twist* as a starting point to develop narrative writing, developing understanding of character and reporting events using *Street Child* by Berlie Doherty.
