

RETURN TO SCHOOL INFORMATION

School is making careful plans and may re-open to more children from Tuesday 2 June (Monday 1 June will be a school closure day for preparation and training). The Government may not make a final decision on this until 28 May when it is satisfied that it is safe to do so. Please read carefully so you can decide whether you will send your child to school. Plans will only go ahead if we are satisfied all risk assessments can be followed.

It is good for children to socialise with other children.

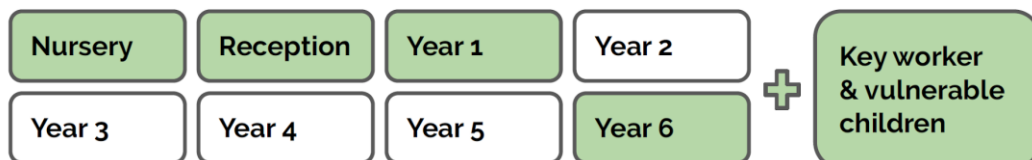


School is the best place for them to learn.

June 1st

Day	Year groups/children in school
Monday (except first week)	Reception and year 6 + key workers and vulnerable children
Tuesday	Reception and year 6 + key workers and vulnerable children
Wednesday	Key workers and vulnerable children
Thursday	Year 1 and nursery + key workers and vulnerable children
Friday	Year 1 and nursery + key workers and vulnerable children

The timetable will change in June/July and parents will be informed when other year groups may be included. **Our priority is safety for everyone.** The LA is recommending that **year 6** return for three weeks, followed by one week home learning and then, from 29 June, a limited transition to allocated secondary school. After June 19, it is anticipated that year 6 will **not** attend primary school.

How are you making sure school is safe?



We will check for risks before school is open.



Everyone will wash their hands regularly.



If a child or family member is sick they can not come to school.



School will be cleaned regularly.



There will be less children in a room together.

Pupils will be in groups (bubbles) of up to ten children, will not mix with other children at any time during the day including lunchtime, and will have a teacher who **MAY NOT** be their usual class teacher.

Does my child have to come to school ?



If your child is well and in one of the groups asked to attend they should.



There will be no fines if your child does not go to school.

If you, someone in the household or your child is in an **extremely clinically vulnerable group**, then attendance is not advised.
